Colégio São Luís (CSL) is a co-ed, private, non-profit, Catholic Jesuit institution. The school is part of the Global network of Jesuit schools, present in all five continents, having more than 2,000 teaching units in 60 countries, 840 units of basic education, and approximately 800,000 students.

In Brazil, it is part of the Network of Jesuit Schools (Rede Jesuíta de Educação or RJE) which comprises 17 schools based on the same identity and sense of apostolic body, with mutual responsibility for the common challenges of the world.

Founded in 1867, Colégio São Luís has a history of pioneering and innovation, which are characteristic of the educational tradition of the Society of Jesus. Colégio São Luís is a school in motion, renewing itself and dialoguing with the challenges of the times in order to offer the education that each generation needs.

The mission of the school is centered on the premise of being a reference in education of academic and human excellence, based on the Christian and Ignatian conception of the human being and the world.

Having an educational tradition of excellence that brings innovation to its core, Colégio São Luís aims at educating students to be creative, competent, conscious, committed and compassionate (5 C's).

There are over 2,200 students (303 students with full scholarship), 132 teachers and academic departments devoted to working in collaboration with teachers to improve the quality of teaching and learning in the school.

Colégio São Luís is accredited by the Brazilian Ministry of Education and by the IBO, for the Diploma Programme.

The school covers fourteen years of education (ranging from 4 to 17 years old): 2 years of kindergarten (Pre I and II), five years of Elementary School (Grades 1, 2, 3, 4, 5), four years of Middle School (Grades 6, 7, 8, 9) and three years of High School (Grades 10, 11, 12).

Our students are immersed in the concept of *Cura Personalis*, meaning "care for the person" that thoughtfully and intentionally integrates the fullness of human experience through the spiritual, intellectual, emotional, social and physical development of our students during their academic years at Colégio São Luís and beyond. Rooted in this tradition, the school has developed seven global competencies, namely communicative, logical, intrapersonal, social and political, collaborative, digital and cultural, which dictate our teaching and learning throughout the different phases of formal education.

CURRICULUM

Grade 12 students in 2023 have either followed the Brazilian National Curriculum, in compliance with the Brazilian national educational documents and PEC (Projeto Educativo Comum), written and developed by the Brazilian Jesuit Network or the IBDP program and the Brazilian National Curriculum.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS – BRAZILIAN DIPLOMA

In 2020, CSL implemented a new curriculum with the following requirements to obtain its high school diploma:

Mandatory courses + 2 electives (1 each semester) + 1 Advanced Topic (year-round) + extracurricular activities (30 credits total in high school)*

Mandatory courses: Portuguese Language, Art (grades 10 and 11), Physical Education, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, History, Geography, Philosophy, Sociology, Text Production (grade 12), English Language (levels C1 and C1+, CEFR), Religious Studies (grades 10 and 11).

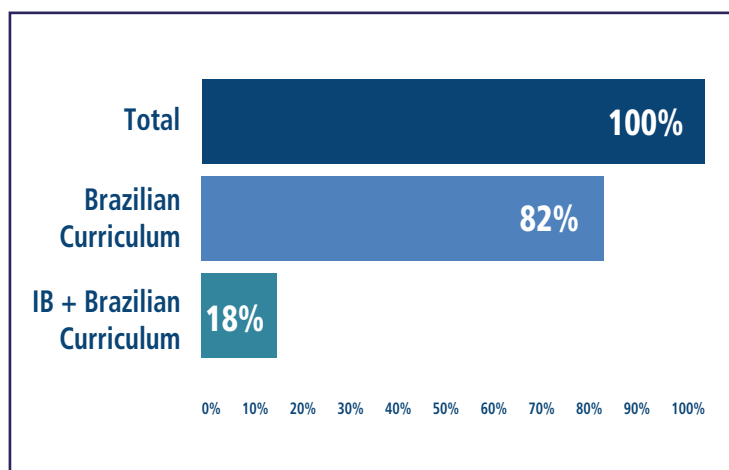
Electives: Current Affairs; Film Studies; Physical Conditioning; 3D Modeling and Robotics; Math Challenges; Financial Education; Entrepreneurship; Photography; Applied Artificial Intelligence; Brazil, Art and Politics; Environmental Studies; Sustainability and Governance; Mythology; Neuroscience and Memory; Music Practice and History of Music; Drawing and Painting; Soccer, Wars, and Religion; Math Challenges II; Marketing, Sculptures and Models; Music Practice and History of Music II; Human Body Investigation; Urban Studies; Packaging and Citizenship; Lights, Camera, Discussion; Sustainable Microscopy; Multiculturalism; Theatrical Practice; Programming; Social Engagement; Rhythm and Movement; Robotics and Sustainability.

Advanced Topics: Advanced History, Geography and Social science, Advanced Biology, Chemistry and Physics Advanced Mathematics, Chemistry and Physics.

GRADING SYSTEM

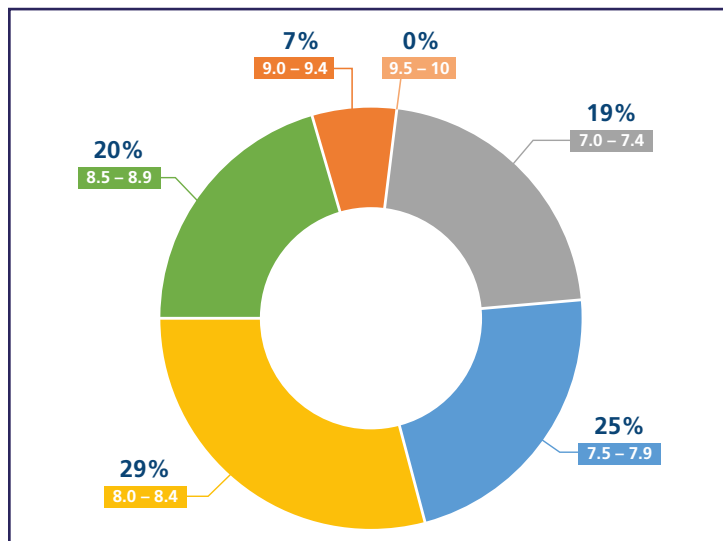
Grades are expressed in figures on a scale from 0.0 to 10.0. The minimum passing grade is 6.0 in each subject.
